Are you looking to experience a semester abroad at a renowned German university? If so, the International Business Certificate (IBC) is an excellent fit for you. This program enables you to attend business classes in English and earn ECTS credits while at ISM. Individual support and academic guidance are integral components of this program, ensuring a comprehensive and enriching experience during your time abroad.

The program consists of **six courses, each carrying 5 ECTS credits**. Consequently, students enrolled in the International Business Certificate Program can earn a total of **30 ECTS credits in a single semester**. A **prerequisite** for enrollment is proficiency at the B2 level of English.

The program is available at **six ISM campuses**:

- Dortmund, Frankfurt, Berlin: spring or fall semester
- Munich, Hamburg: fall semester only
- Cologne: spring semester only

Recognizing that studying abroad is a significant decision, we are committed to **providing a supportive environment** where you can not only excel academically but also experience **personal growth** and explore new horizons.

Furthermore, we offer a comprehensive online course package that allows you to earn 30 ECTS credits entirely online.

Why ISM Dortmund

For me, the choice to do my semester abroad in Germany was an easy decision to make. Then there was the Buddy Program organized by ISM, which was an amazing way for us to get to know other students not just from different campuses of ISM but also from different course blocks of ISM Dortmund. The Buddy Program gave to each and every one of us a Buddy with whom we were able to chat before the semester start and while abroad, if we wanted to get some tips or ask something about Dortmund or Germany in general and that was very cool. Because of the changing course schedule we had a lot of free time during the weeks, which was great because it gave us the possibility to explore Germany and do something with our new friends. During my free time I traveled a lot with friends through NRW because I wanted to explore new cities and see new places. The campus in Dortmund was founded in 1990 and, with around 670 students, is ISM's largest location. It is surrounded by a thriving technology park and only 15 minutes from the city center.

In recent years, Dortmund has developed from a former coal and steel center into a booming location for modern technologies. As the largest city in Westphalia and the Rhine-Ruhr metropolitan region, Dortmund is one of the most dynamic cities representing the new economy in Germany.

The Campus Frankfurt/Main opened in 2007 and is located in Sachsenhausen, two underground stations away from the city center. 620 students are currently enrolled here.

Frankfurt is the city with the highest job density in Germany and an important European financial and service center. It also has other important industries such as creative businesses, IT and telecommunications, biotechnology or life sciences, logistics and industry.

The Hamburg campus was opened in September 2010. 520 students are currently studying in our two modern buildings at the HafenCity. The city center and the main railway station are only a ten-minute walk away. Whether you are looking for a cosmopolitan metropolis or the rough hanseatic charm, Hamburg combines many facets. As cultural and economic center of Northern Germany, Hamburg's structure is characterized by the service sector, in which around three quarters of all employees are working.

Since 2014, ISM has had a campus in Cologne. Currently, 380 students are studying at the ISM campus, not far from the Hansaring S-Bahn station. Cologne is one of the most important business hubs in Germany and impresses with its convenient location. Its tradition as center for trade and industry goes back to the Roman Empire. In recent decades, the region has been able to expand its position as a service and logistics center and to build up a special reputation as an innovative media city.
